COURT MATTERS

 Adaptors matter has not been finalized. It will be sitting in Court before the end of the year 2010

 Access to Documentation matter is still outstanding

CHALLENGES

- Levies declarations remains a challenge, coupled with the World wide credit crunch which shrink the Regulator's purse
- Turn around times continue to be a challenge with the 2 accredited laboratories having to share the industry needs and that of the Regulator
- Some regulated products have to be tested overseas which also posses a challenge around logistics and accreditation of those (International) laboratories
- Insufficient Testing facilities in RSA continues to be a huge challenge
- Every person is an Importer, some are internet based

OPPORTUNITIES TO IMPLEMENT THE LAW

- Legal Action taken against non-compliant Products in courts
- Voluntary Recall and destructions by individual Companies
- Raids and Group Inspections with other law enforcement Agencies
- Monthly meetings with Laboratories to monitor progress
- Verifying Levy Payments in the market
- Co-operation with the Chinese Regulators on imported products to SA as well as opening that market for RSA Companies
- Benchmarking exercise with other Regulators for best practices (USA)
